A Heart of Gratitude | Alanyo Violet, Leadership Program Student

One of the most challenging aspects of adulthood is balance. Balancing work. Balancing family. Balancing the intangible (but very real) spiritual, emotional, and psychological pieces of our lives. Though situations differ among cultures and places, the struggle for balance is universal.

Alanyo Violet learned that hard truth earlier than some as she experienced childhood trauma and family tension. She elaborated, "I am the first born in a family of seven. I was a shy and isolated girl who was traumatized when I was burnt with steaming porridge on my head at the age of eight. I got a big scar on my head. Secondly, I grew up with a step mother who denied me the motherly love I needed in my life."

But if you saw her now, you would never suspect a story like that. She has a new light in her that shines far brighter than any darkness she has experienced in her life.

When she began attending the Leadership Academy of South Sudan, Alanyo Violet was introduced to Jesus. She didn't just hear about him or read about him, she experienced him through the unity among students and staff at the Academy despite tribal differences. She recognized his unconditional love when her classmates came alongside her, wiped away her tears, and spurred her on toward a better life and a brighter future. Her mentors helped her find reconciliation – even when other parties did not agree – so that she could discover renewed hope and purpose for her life.

Today, she's a proud senior at the Academy, ready to graduate and not only pursue a career, but become a leader. Instead of hanging on to her hurtful past, she plans to use it for good:

"My vision is to stretch out a merciful hand embodied in the life of Jesus to all the needy children and orphans in South Sudan and beyond. I believe through the mentorship I have received at this school, I will achieve my dreams. I thank to God for His unwavering goodness to me."

Finding Hope | Yafis Zacharia's Story

After losing touch with his family when war broke out in Sudan in 2014, Yafis Zacharia found himself in a refugee camp as a child. Being so young in a brand-new place filled with people from unfamiliar tribes and cultures, he felt completely lost without his family.

So, he did the only thing he knew. He did his chores, and he went to the settlement's primary school. Years passed, and after finishing primary, he was given the chance to attend a reputable secondary school in the area. He worked hard, and he loved learning, so it was no surprise that he passed his Ugandan education certification exam. He felt driven to continue his education, attend university and pursue a career, but he didn't have the resources. He could barely make ends meet for day-to-day living much less pay for college.

Yet Yafis Zacharia knew he couldn't give up on his dream. He decided to raise money for school by starting a business selling meat. He knew it would take a while, but it could work!

He put God to the side for a while, thinking he could focus on his faith later. He stopped going to church because Sunday was another day to do business. That's when things started to unravel. He explained, "I was mentally tortured to the point I had lost hope in the future. I could not even pray or hold a Bible."

Yafis Zacharia felt like he was swimming upstream trying to achieve his dreams....until his former teacher reconnected with him and told him about the Leadership Academy of South Sudan. As God would have it, they would be holding interviews in his area soon. He took that as a second chance and confidently passed his interview.



All it takes is a God-initiated turning point. After acceptance into the Academy, Yafis Zacharia told us,



"When I came to LASS, there was a complete transformation of my life. I embraced the discipleship curriculum, which was not the case in the Ugandan schools I attended. I am a changed person who can now pray and preach very well. I have also been taught to embrace unity in diversity as I see all people as brother and sisters regardless of tribe or origin. My vision is to speak out against tribalism in Sudan and beyond; and I believe through the mentorship I get, God will help me achieve my dreams."

We believe in the power of prayer. Thank you for praying and investing in young leaders like Alanyo Violet and Yafis Zacharia, our brother and sister in Christ – thank you for partnering with 4africa to be the hands and feet of Jesus.

You've probably noticed by now that our work and ministry go hand-in-hand. 4africa's water and preventative health programs allow us to care for those in need while providing opportunities to share the gospel. As we moved from community to community this quarter, we provided clean, safe water to approximately 10,500 people through sustainable, community-led projects. While that's pretty great news, the fact that they heard the real, eternal Good News of Jesus is even more exciting! Through field devotions, well dedications, and interactive health forums, we were able to personally reach out to 3,682 people with the gospel in addition to holding 12 discipleship classes for non-believers and establishing 31 community-led Bible studies throughout the area we serve.

I know we said fewer numbers, but those were just too good to leave out! We thank you for partnering with us and praise God for moving mountains! Will you continue to pray with us as we enter the fourth quarter?

Equipped for Ministry | Jackson Moro's Story

When Jackson Moro first arrived at the Bidi Bidi Refugee Settlement in Uganda after fleeing a hostile life in South Sudan, he had no idea what to expect. At just twenty years old, he planned to keep his head low and make do with what he had. Faith was already a priority in his life – that's what had gotten him this far – but he felt far from equipped to share it with others. Plus, he didn't want to make waves as a newcomer in an unfamiliar place.

But then, like he often does, God opened some surprising doors for Jackson Moro. 4africa team members recognized him as a Person of Peace:

"Whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace be to this house!' And if a son of peace is there, your peace will rest upon him." Luke 10:5-6b (ESV)

Even in his quietness, his faith was apparent. He eagerly agreed to meet with them to learn more about God's Word and how to share the Good News with others in his community and school. At the beginning, Jackson Moro confessed, "I used to face difficulties sharing the word of God with my schoolmates, but today, I am empowered and strengthened to share the word of God."

Equipped with even more discipleship tools through Disciple Making Movement sessions, he feels more confident in studying the Word for himself and sharing that Truth with others.

He explained, "I am now enlightened to do more for the kingdom of God than ever before. So far we have six Discovery Bible Groups and formed a Scripture Union in my school where I serve as the chairperson."

Inspired by the Word and impassioned to help young people, Jackson is now the youth leader at the church where he worships. He is grateful for the privilege to grow in the Word of God, and it is his prayer that he continues to learn more every day to share the Word with his peers.

Sometimes we find it easier to give to tangible programs like water, health, and education, but with your continual prayer and support, we can also equip our ministry teams with resources that will impact souls, transform communities, and bring eternal hope for those who are searching.
