These days, it feels like the only thing we can be certain of is uncertainty itself. It can be difficult to see goodness in the chaos and confusion we're living in, but I find that when I look hard enough, I can discover good and amazing things happening every day.

One of those amazing things is YOU and the impact you made through 4africa during our 2019-2020 fiscal year. As you read through the incredible stories of hope we share in this report, my prayer is that you're reminded of God's goodness all the time, even in the most uncertain times.

When our fiscal year began in July 2019, we could never have anticipated what was to come. We thought the year would be all about scaling our existing programs while expanding into other underserved regions in Northern Uganda and building deeper relationships with our leadership students and alumni.

Initially, everything looked promising. We saw astonishing growth and experienced God's provision like never before. Then, COVID-19 hit. While many nonprofits pivoted, we leaned harder into our WASH and health programs knowing full-well they would be instrumental in preventing the spread of the virus in the communities we serve.

Thanks to the love and support of people like you, we were able to provide thousands of people with what they needed most – soap, water, handwashing stations, COVID-19 prevention trainings and encouragement – when they needed it most.

The pandemic also presented us with a unique opportunity to launch a new radio ministry to share important COVID-19 updates and prevention messages along with gospel messages of hope with thousands of people across N. Uganda.

Through your support, we were able to help prevent the spread of COVID-19 while sharing the gospel of Jesus with thousands who've never heard it before.

While we will continue to respond to the COVID-19 crisis as long as needed, our focus this year is on empowering people to not just survive, but thrive, both physically and spiritually. For too long, we've watched people barely "get by" with a "survival mentality." Moving forward, we aim to eliminate this mentality by elevating the church and equipping leaders to help the people in their communities experience more fruitful, fulfilling and sustainable lives. This aspiration is at the core of 4africa and we do it all in Jesus' name.

Hadija's story

Having clean water should be a basic human right, yet many still lack access. Without clean water, illnesses spread, children can't attend school, and life becomes a burden.

We're here to change that. 4africa strives to make clean, safe water accessible to vulnerable communities across East Africa so families like Hadija's can live more fulfilling and healthy lives.

SOMETHING NEEDED TO CHANGE

Hadija took a high-stakes gamble every time she visited the river. As a mother of four, her family required quite a bit of water for drinking, cooking, cleaning and bathing. Meanwhile, a jerrycan only holds five gallons. Not only were the frequent trips to the river exhausting – imagine hiking with a 40-pound jerrycan on your head! – the river water contained harmful bacteria and parasites.

Hadija knew the contaminated water she brought back to her children could cause diseases like cholera, typhoid, and hepatitis E, but she had no other choice. This was the closest water source to her remote community of Aringa Chaku in Yumbe, Uganda.

The situation became worse in the dry season. When the river dried up, Hadija had to leave her children each morning to walk four kilometers roundtrip to a crowded tap in another community. The long walks and long waits took their toll on all aspects of life. The kids suffered constant illnesses and stomach pain which kept them from attending school. Hadija spent so much time fetching

water, domestic chores piled up and meals were served hours late. Each day was more of the same without hope that things would change. Hadija's greatest wish was that her kids could have a normal, healthy childhood and that she could spend it with them instead of trekking for water.

"The Lord is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit." Psalm 24:18

God's love knows no bounds when caring for his children. Presented with the opportunity to bring clean water to Hadija's community, 4africa's well drilling team got to work! During that time, we got to know families like Hadija's. We prayed and worshipped together. We praised God for the chance to provide essentials like clean water and preventative health trainings.

Lifelong friendships are just one of the many upsides of our work. Seeing lives transformed is another.

"We are now safe from diseases, and my children can now go to school early because the [well] is near my home. Other [household] work like washing clothes, cooking, and farming will be easy because I don't have to spend so much time looking for water," Hadija said. "I deeply appreciate 4africa for bringing us safe and abundant water. May God reward you for your good work!"

The impact of clean, safe water in a community is significantly compounded when coupled with robust health, hygiene and sanitation initiatives. Our goal is to drastically reduce waterborne diseases as well as many other common sanitation and hygiene issues across all genders, generations, tribes, religions, and political affiliations. We seek to impart good health, hygiene, and sanitation as learned behaviors.

Deboru's story

It's hard to imagine, but soap, water and even bathroom facilities are coveted resources for many around the globe.

In fact, about 2.4 billion people worldwide still lack access to safe water and sanitation facilities. Waterborne and hygiene-related illnesses like cholera, typhoid, dysentery, and parasites plague communities lacking clean water and sanitation facilities. (WHO, 2015)

We're here to change that. When communities receive access to clean water and learn about proper hygiene, quality of life is restored – kids can return to school, parents can return to work, and the burden of illness is lifted.

In August 2019, 4africa drilled a well for the Owayi Community in Northern Uganda to provide clean, safe water to over 380 people. We recently checked in with our friends in Owayi to see how they're doing. Deboru Alice, a 51-year-old mother of three, proudly shared her community's transformation story:

"We were fetching from two open wells nearby. Unfortunately, they dried up each summer. So, we would walk to Terego District, which is three kilometers away, in search for water. We suffered from bilharzia and typhoid, and the place was infested with tsetse flies," Deboru said.

During the weeks leading up to the drilling of the well, 4africa's health team shared with the community about why they are chronically sick. The team demonstrated how to prevent hygiene-related illnesses by constructing latrines, trash pits, dish-drying racks, and handwashing stations with available resources.

By implementing what they learned, Deboru and her neighbors soon found that clean water and improved sanitation practices make a big difference.

"I used to frequent the hospital before the borehole was constructed. But now, our community's health has greatly improved," Deboru continued. "We don't catch waterborne diseases that used to affect us now because we have clean water and we know how to prevent sickness. We keep the area around the well clean so the water does not get contaminated, and we no longer go to the tsetse fly-infested streams."

Thanks to your continued support, our friends in Owayi have taken charge of their health!

TODAY, THE MAJORITY OF HOUSEHOLDS DRINK CLEAN WATER AND USE RESTROOM FACILITIES WITH HANDWASHING STATIONS THEY BUILT THEMSELVES.

Instead of spending weeks in the hospital and money on endless treatments, community members like Deboru can focus on their families and the things that matter most.

Diana's story

Africa's Leadership Academy of South Sudan (LASS) goes beyond academics. Many of our students have faced unimaginable hardships, so our holistic curriculum includes a balance of academic, professional, discipleship and character development classes. The goal: promote healing and build brighter futures. After their time at LASS, our hope is that every student is equipped and empowered to lead boldly for Christ. Here's how Diana, a LASS graduate, is doing just that:

DEVELOPING CHRISTLIKE LEADERS

One of six children, Diana was born in a refugee settlement in Northern Uganda after her parents fled the war in South Sudan. Fortunately, unlike most men from her tribe, her father was a proponent of education for girls and encouraged Diana and her sisters to attend primary school.

While Diana loved school and excelled in it, she was forced to drop out when she was just eight-years-old after her family took in 15 orphaned children. With so many mouths to feed, the whole family, kids included, had to work.

For several years Diana worked on a farm cultivating the land and selling its produce. In the little spare time she had, she kept up her studies as best as she could. It's hard to imagine what life must have been like for Diana, but if there's one truth we can hold on to, it's that God is always working for the good of those who love Him and have been called according to his purpose. (Romans 8:28) And He has big plans for Diana!

When she was a teenager, Diana was finally able to return to school. But because her parents returned to South Sudan to work while their children remained in Uganda, life wasn't easy.

"I remember that we were left as children to feed ourselves. We were a child-headed household, but my parents sent money for school fees and food," she said.

Knowing a good education was the key to a brighter future, Diana focused hard on her schoolwork. She woke every morning at 4 a.m. to help with family chores before heading to school, then returned home to cook dinner and study.

Her hard work paid off. In 2015 Diana was accepted into the Leadership Academy of South Sudan and awarded a scholarship. She worked harder than ever at LASS, but more importantly, she developed a deep relationship with Christ.

"Even though I was born in a refugee camp, my identity is not found there," she said. "Rather, by God's grace, my future won't be determined by my past. I have been transformed."

Today, the 24-year-old is in her second year of university working on a degree in social work and social administration while pursuing her God-given purpose.

"I want to give back to my community. My dream is to start a school in South Sudan using the basics I got from LASS. We've begun by creating an NGO that takes care of refugee orphans," Diana said.

With the support of people like you, it won't be long before LASS alumni like Diana bring positive and transforming change to their communities and countries. Together, we're changing the narrative by empowering Christ-like leaders.

Winnie's story

ON A MISSION TO LOVE LIKE JESUS

"How beautiful on the mountains are the feet of those who bring good news, who proclaim peace, who bring good tidings, who proclaim salvation, who say to Zion, 'Your God reigns!'" Isaiah 52:7

Oftentimes, personal experiences pave the way to truth. As humans, it's much easier to have faith in God when we experience His love firsthand. This is exactly why we infuse all of our programs with ministry. Caring for physical needs allows us to tangibly demonstrate God's love.

In Aiinga, a community within Yumbe District in Northern Uganda, 4africa worked with partners to rehabilitate a broken borehole, bringing clean water to the community while building trust and inroads with those living there.

While working in Aiinga, our team met Winnie Giff. Recognizing her as a "Person of Peace" within this predominantly non-Christian community, we invited her to join our community led ministry team. An answer to prayer, she agreed.

After receiving training and resources through the Disciple Making Movement program, she went out boldly in Jesus' name.

Winnie's faith is inspiring. The majority of her neighbors in her community have never heard of Jesus. In fact, many have deep religious and cultural beliefs that contradict the gospel. Sharing the gospel could have hurt Winnie's reputation and relationships within her community – with those she loved most. But nothing could stand in her way to bring renewed hope and peace to her community.

On a personal mission to love like Jesus, Winnie was able to share the gospel with several unreached families who, today, hold Discovery Bible Studies (similar to church small groups here in the US) in their homes, leading the people of Aiinga to Jesus!

According to Winnie, the rehabilitation of the borehole by a Christian organization presented a unique opportunity

to reach unbelievers with the gospel because they are eager to know about the God who reached down to meet their physical needs. Through her ministry, she's been able to reach many Muslim brothers and sisters across the district. Today, they proclaim the gospel alongside her to other nonbelievers.

"The previous water challenges in Aiinga Community gave the people very little time to think about God. Due to their prolonged suffering, it was difficult for them to believe that God could change their situation," Winne said. "Since they have seen that God can provide through his servants, they are more welcoming and willing to listen to the message of salvation that we share with them."

"A spiritual revival is surely underway for the community of Aiinga," Winnie continued.

While COVID-19 has limited the number of people who can attend larger Discovery Bible Studies (DBS), smaller home-based DBS are popping up as *persons of peace* like Winnie continue to share the gospel with unreached and unengaged people throughout the district.

Additionally, through our new radio ministry on Spirit FM Uganda, we've had the opportunity to share encouraging messages of hope with thousands of people throughout Northern Uganda. Dozens of listeners have called in and openly given their lives to Christ. We've also started a hospital ministry to pray over the sick. Through these unique opportunities, we've had the joy of introducing thousands to Jesus Christ.

Thank you for helping us make an impact in Northern Uganda, and more importantly, God's kingdom!

Emergency Relief Ministry

All that was missing were the resources needed to implement the plan, but we knew our 4africa family would join us to support the cause.

Your quick response was overwhelming! While navigating the difficulties of the pandemic yourself, you helped us demonstrate God's love and unwavering presence during uncertain times.

Because of your prayers and contributions, we were able to support the local government and equip the communities we serve with the necessary essentials to combat the spread.

Thanks to YOU, hundreds of thousands of refugees and residents in Yumbe now have the resources they need to protect themselves from COVID-19.

"We are lucky that we were provided a handwashing station and soap at the market by 4africa which we are using religiously," said Dawa Zainab, a food vendor at a local market. "Currently, I am protecting myself and my family from the coronavirus by ensuring we wash our hands all the time."

Through your support, utilizing radio, we've also been able to reach over a million people beyond our immediate area of focus with critical COVID prevention messages as well as the gospel.

"There are people who speak about coronavirus on the radio and this has helped me to know more about it," said 16-year-old Kevin Ajoya. "I am going to continue doing what I have been told so that I remain healthy."
